Precision teaching Evidence based intervention recommended by Educational psychologists for catch-up	Children in Year 3 and below are learning missed phonics and spellings. Targeted at those already behind and now further behind ARE. The children will make above expected progress based on target tracker and phonics screening checks scores.	£4000	
Reading Intervention package linked to benchmark comprehension tests	All children across the school can now access a computerised reading comprehension intervention if necessary which is targeted specifically to their needs. The children will make accelerated progress based on target tracker progress measures.	£500	
Maths curriculum resources	All children can benefit from resources within a developed curriculum and mastery approach which is developed to benefit all learners. As part of the structure, TA time is used to pre-teach concepts or teach via over learning.	£1000

Additional resources to support curriculum learning	Additional resources (both on-line and physical) have been purchased and used across the curriculum. Some of these can also be accessed from home to support learning. Children have an enriched experienced of the curriculum and a high quality learning provision. Parents can support learning from home.	£1000	
Additional TA support	TA time has been allocated across the school to support individual needs. Specific support has been allocated for those children who need support transitioning from home to school and ensure they make progress. Children are able to settle in school and have their wellbeing safeguarded.	£3660
